Worksheet: “Racist terms – legacy of the colonial era?”

Exercise: Look at the grid and tick off: Which characteristics do you think apply to the term “Africa”? Which terms do you associate with “Africa”? The closer you set your cross to the term/characteristic, the more you agree.

Discuss your tables with your groupmates and answer these questions:

- How did you do the scoring?
- Do you all have the same evaluation?
- Where did you get the "knowledge" about your answers?
- What do you think the exercise has to do with our topic?

Possible questions for the discussion: “Racist terms – legacy of the colonial era?”

- » What is your image of the African continent? What images of the African continent are presented in schoolbooks, in the media, etc.?
- » Do you know other words that you consider to have a negative connotation?
- » What else do you associate with the African continent?
- » What could be the consequences of using often words that have negative connotation?
- » How do “Black Persons” / “Black People” refer to themselves in Germany?
- » What does “Person of Colour” / ”People of Colour” mean? Which terms would you choose in German and why?
- » What can we do to change negative images and knowledge about the African continent?
- » Do you or did you in the past use words that others used to criticize you?
- » Were you ever referred to or described with a word that made you feel uncomfortable?
- » What can you do if you notice that someone is using words that are harmful/discriminative? Have you ever been in a situation where this happened?
- » Does it make a difference whether you use a word/term as a joke or seriously?
- » What may happen if the affected person stops regarding something discriminative or racist as funny?

Possible questions for the final discussion:

- » What do you think about changing street names?
- » Which names / terms would you suggest?
- » Should we talk more about colonialism, for example in school?
- » Do we need places and spaces as a reminder of colonialism?
- » How can former colonial empires apologize to the formerly colonized people?
- » Should former colonial empires give back the goods, e.g., works of art, that they have stolen from the formerly colonized territories?
- » What can each one of us do to create a reminder of the colonial era?
- » What are you going to do with the things that we discussed in today's workshop?
